Call to Confession (Please be seated)

Pastor: As disciples of Jesus Christ, we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from the love of God and neighbor.

Repentance, fasting, prayer, study and works of love help us return to that love. I invite you, therefore, to commit yourself to love God and neighbor by confessing your sin and by asking God for strength to persevere in your Lenten discipline.

Confession of Sin

Pastor: Let us pray.

All: Most holy and merciful God:

We confess to you and to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and deed by what we have done and by what we have left undone.

Pastor: We have not loved you with all our heart, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.

All: We are sorry, O God. (Silence)

Pastor: We have been deaf to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit.

All: We are sorry, O God. (Silence)

Pastor: We confess to you, O God, all our past unfaithfulness. The pride, hypocrisy, and impatience in our lives,

All: We are sorry, O God. (Silence)

Pastor: The ways that we have taken advantage of others.,

All: We are sorry, O God. (Silence)

Pastor: Our anger at our own frustration and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves,

All: We are sorry, O God. (Silence)

Pastor: Our negligence in prayer and worship and our failure to grow the faith that is in us,

All: We are sorry, O God. (Silence)

Pastor: *For our neglect of human need and suffering and our indifference to injustice and cruelty,*

All: We are sorry, O God. (Silence)

Pastor: *For all false judgments, for unkind thoughts toward others, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us,*

All: We are sorry, O God. (Silence)

Pastor: *For our waste and pollution of your creation and our lack of concern for those who come after us,*

All: We are sorry, O God. (Silence)

Pastor: *Restore us, O God, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors.*

All: Hear us O God and grant us you peace, in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen

THE ASHES OF FORGIVENESS

Pastor: *Ashes are a symbol of purification. As a fire burns, it can separate what is valuable from what is valueless. Ashes represent the purity of Jesus and the value that he can bring to our lives through our spiritual practices and good works throughout the forty days of this Lenten season.*

As you receive your ashes, remember these words; "Turn away from your sins and believe the good news."

(Receiving the ashes is optional. Those who wish may come forward at this time to receive the ashes of forgiveness. For those who cannot come forward, please raise your hand and we will bring the ashes to your seat.)

Prayer

All: Accomplish in us, O God, the work of your amazing grace. By that grace may we shine your light in the dark places of this world. Through the cross and suffering of our Savior, bring us to the joy of Christ's resurrection. Amen

Pastor: *Almighty God does not desire the death of sinners, but rather that we may turn from our wickedness and live. Therefore we beg God to grant us true repentance and pray that by the movement of the Holy Spirit the things which we do this night may be pleasing to God, that the rest of our lives may be lived faithfully and that at the last we may come to God's eternal joy; through Jesus the Christ.*

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION, Rev. Dr. Robert McKie

The Invitation

Pastor: *This table is open to all who confess Jesus as the Christ and seek to follow in Christ's way. Come to this sacred table not because you must, but because you may. Come not because you are fulfilled, but because in your emptiness you stand in need of God's mercy and assurance. Come not to express an opinion, but to seek a presence and to pray for a spirit. Come to this table then, sisters and brothers, as you are. Partake and share that we might again know that God has come to us, shared our common lot, and invited us to join the people of God's new age.*

Communion Prayer

Pastor: *God be with you.*

People: **And also with you.**

Pastor: *Lift up your hearts.*

Pastor: **We lift them to God.**

Pastor: *Let us give thanks to God Most High.*

Pastor: **It is right to give God thanks and praise.**

Pastor: *We give you thanks, God of majesty and mercy, for calling forth the creation and raising us from dust by the breath of your being. We bless you for the beauty and bounty of the earth and for the vision of the day when sharing by all will mean scarcity for none.*

We remember the covenant you made with your people Israel, and we give you thanks for all our ancestors in faith. We rejoice that you call us to reconciliation with you and all people everywhere and that you remain faithful to your covenant even when we are faithless.

We rejoice that you call the entire human family to this table of sacrifice and victory.

We come in remembrance and celebration of the gift of Jesus Christ, whom you sent, in the fullness of time, to be the good news. Born of Mary, our sister in faith, Christ lived among us to reveal the mystery of your Word, to suffer and die on the cross for us, to be raised from death on the third day, and then to live in glory.

For in the night of betrayal Jesus took bread, and after giving thanks to you, broke the bread, and gave it to the disciples, and said: "Take, eat: This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also after supper, Jesus took the cup, and after giving you thanks, gave it to them and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you and many, for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Holy One, show forth among us the presence of your life-giving Word and Holy Spirit, to sanctify us and your entire church through these holy mysteries. Grant that all who share the communion of the body and blood of our risen Savior may be one in Jesus Christ. May we remain faithful in love and hope, until the perfect feast with our exalted Savior in the eternal joy of your heavenly realm. Amen
